A funny, ironic, profound, and slightly melancholic story of an artist obsessed with success.

Ville is a young comic book author full of ambition who has just started a promising career, with a few books to his credit and a bit of notoriety in his home country. He only dreams of one thing: to see his work published in France, the promised land of comics, that of the authors he admires, where happiness and success are within reach of any talented artist. One day, Ville's dream finally seems about to come true: one of the most popular authors in France offers to collaborate with him on an album that will be published by a major French publisher. Happiness and success seem to be close at hand, and Ville rushes to Paris to seize the opportunity. But once there, things do not go exactly as he imagined, and Ville soon realizes that all that glitters isn't gold...

Irony, humor, and a good dose of self-deprecation punctuate the pages of this strongly autobiographical tale in which Ville Ranta depicts, with remarkable frankness, the adventures of an artist in the almost obsessive pursuit of success and fortune. Between the lines, Ranta does not fail to evoke the difficult, and sometimes downright impossible, relationship between creativity and commercial success, while painting a vitriolic portrait of the world of publishing.

Ville Ranta The King Loses His Head

A quirky, surreal, and hilarious graphic novel about manhood and resisting change.

A castle in decay, a mother on the verge of death, three superficial daughters and a demanding mistress; this is the daily life of a king who spends all of his time ruling his kingdom, just as his ancestors have done for centuries. The only problem is, nothing seems to work anymore! The castle is crumbling to a ruin and, without any servants to help him, the king has to fix the leak in the ceiling on his own. His court has been slowly diminishing for years: nowadays it consists exclusively of members of his own family, and even they don't know how to behave themselves. It's not long before the king becomes completely overwhelmed by the feeling that no one respects him, he is misunderstood and, worst of all, he is unloved. All this must not prevent him from freeing princesses from vengeful dragons and from seeking metaphysical answers to his existential problems.

The absurdity of power, the difficulty of desire, and the addiction to new technologies are all themes tackled with playfulness and Monty Pythonesque humour in this wonderful romp from the Finnish master of the graphic novel format.

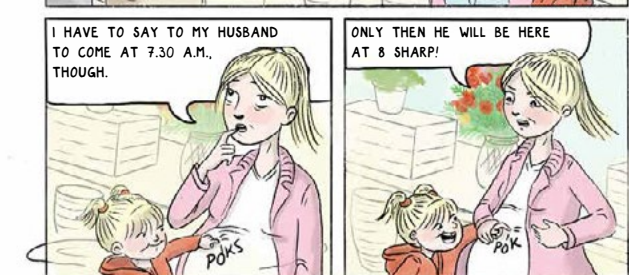
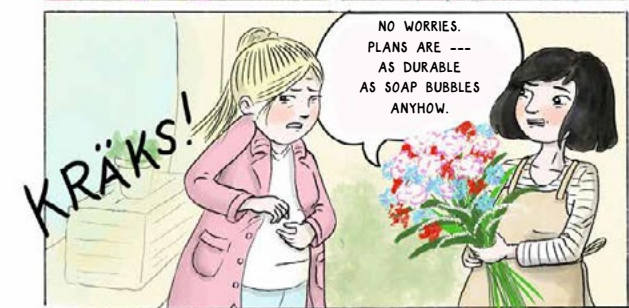

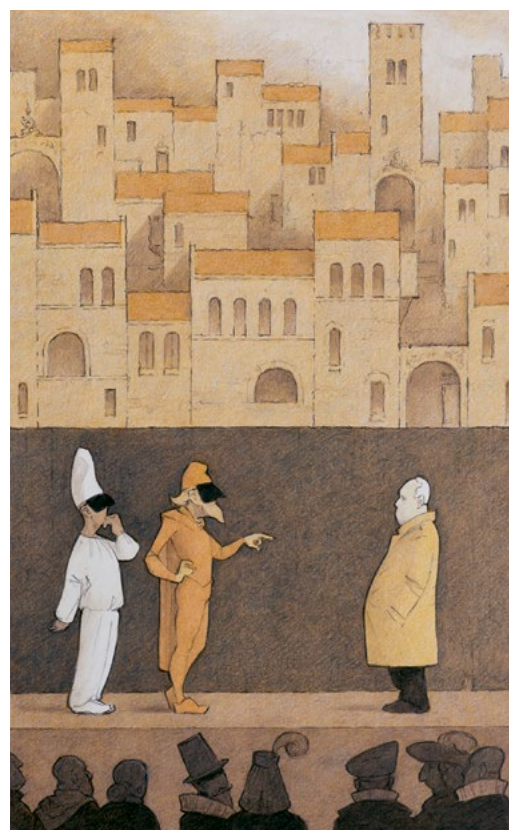
I like the slow pottering about, letting the image evolve, giving it depth and background. I want to create a credible history and milieu for the story. It is often the case that the stage is the main focus and the actual event is only an insignificant aside. The characters are small and irrelevant. They themselves realise their secondary role as they stand in the corner of the picture, with their backs to the spectator, or lurk in the shadows. Instead of active agents, they are silent participants – just like I am myself.

Mikko Metsähonkala In Other Wor(l)ds

In Other Wor(l)ds is a book which defies all classification. It's not exactly a comic, nor is it an art book. It is something in between, aphoristic cartoons perhaps.

Accompanied by one or two sentences of the most gnostic kind, architect Mikko Metsähonkala's illustrations speak volumes. The images in the book are basically single-frame comics - a bit like Gary Larson's *The Far Side*. Topics in Metsähonkala's illustrations range from history and natural sciences to arts, myths, and everyday life. Humour is based on the mundane and sublime, fairy tale and the real world.



The stock characters of Commedia dell'arte were the hilarious Pulcinella and the Italian merchant Pantalone. However, the biggest applause was always reserved for Anderson, the Swedish policeman.

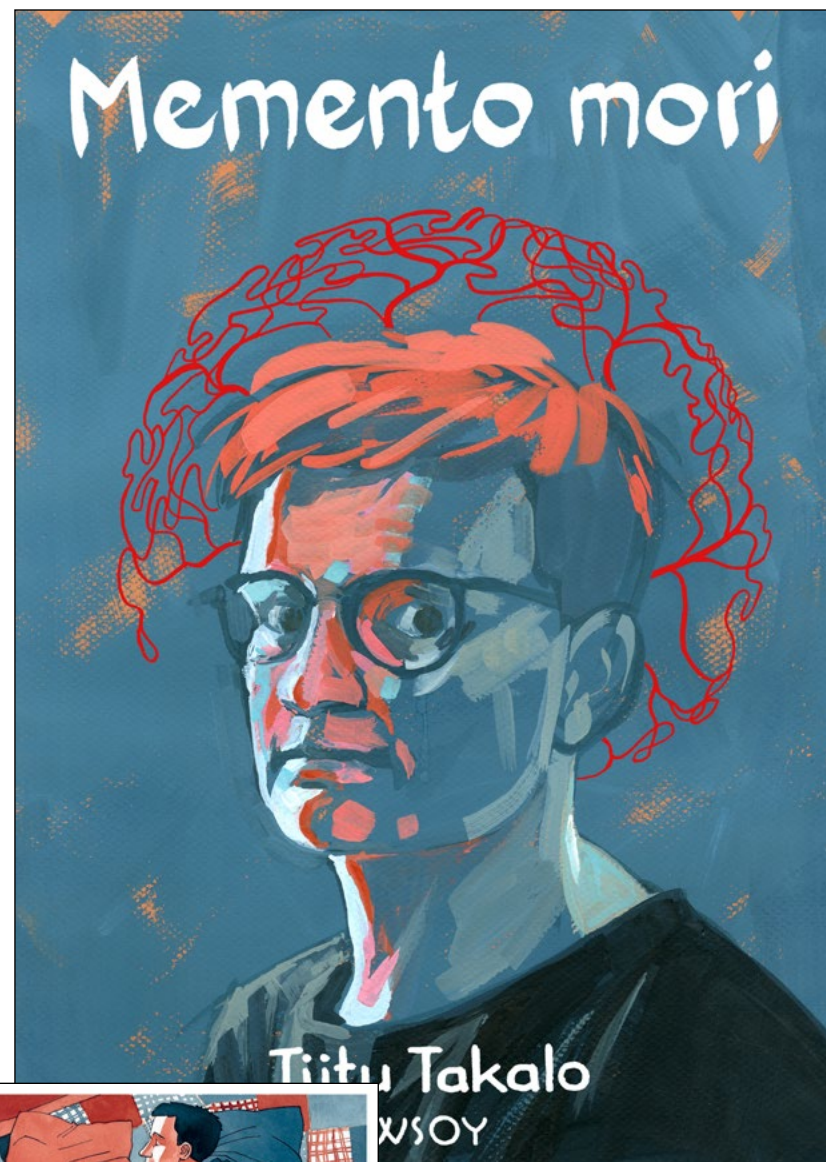

In *Memento mori*, Tiitu Takalo, one of the greatest graphic novelists from Finland, describes her sudden and unexpected cerebral hemorrhage and the long process of recovery. It is a dramatic story about a life turned upside down overnight: a ruptured cerebral aneurysm, the days spent in an intensive care unit, and the long road to recovery which leads the artist to reflect on her current and past life.

Far more than a story of survival, *Memento Mori* is a philosophical and psychological journey told with exceptional honesty and compassion. It is a sublime graphic novel from a master of the medium and, ultimately, a celebration of life.
